Chestertown MD September 18, 2023 For Immediate Release

The Chestertown Lions Club will host their annual Halloween Parade on **Saturday, October 28th commencing at 1 pm in downtown Chestertown.** This annual event has been delighting locals and visitors of all ages for over fifty years. The parade will proceed down High St beginning from Kent St. and ending at Queen St.

The parade will feature live music by Butch Clark with MC Mark Mumford, along with certificates and cash prizes awarded for best costume in a number of categories from pre-school to adult. In the parade will be marching bands, numerous floats and performers, with candy dispensing along the parade route.

Costumed participants may register and queue up in front of Sacred Heart Church up to 90 minutes prior to the 1 PM parade start, but must have registered before 12:45 pm.

The parade theme is Halloween and geared toward children, therefore floats should relate to that theme and avoid overtly commercial or social/political signage and presentation. Float owners need not register, however they are expected to adhere to all safety precautions for their riders and the public; any signage should be minimal. Floats must line up across from Dixon Drive on High St. Floats may register at the starting area between 11 am and 12:45 at the latest.

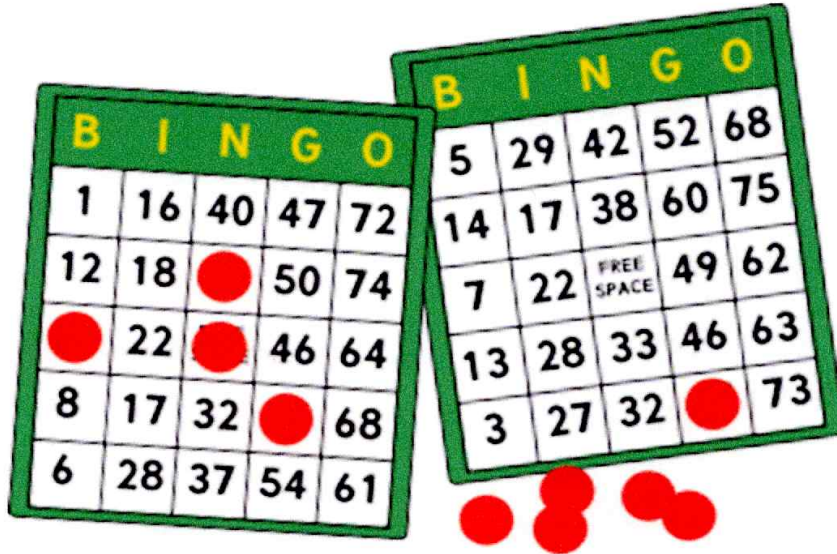

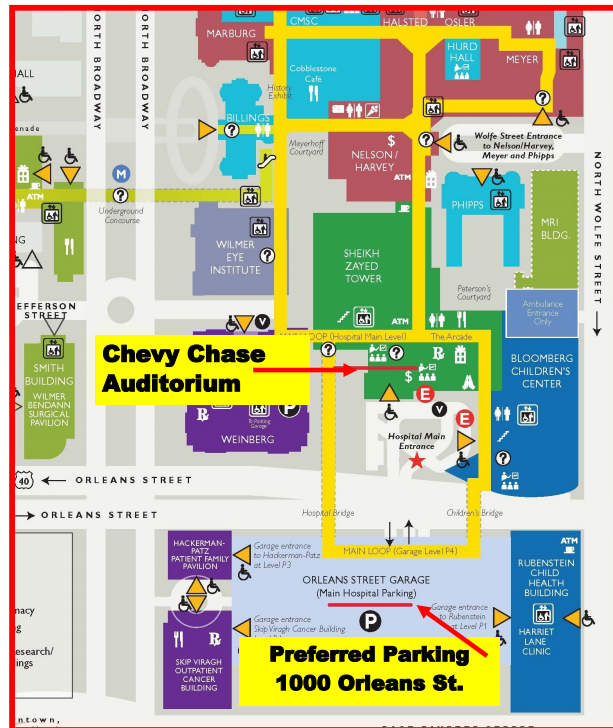

Lions Club International gets considerable monies from worldwide foundations because of the services it performs. Service measured by the numbers each club submits. So please submit your reports. The whole world will benefit.

As I have spoken to the Service Chairs of each club, I have reminded them of the practice of inviting non- Lions to help in their service activities or fundraisers. Nonmembers may enjoy working with your club, enjoying the comradery and good deeds, and decide they would like to be a part of this great organization. Several clubs have told me this is exactly how they obtained new members.

I would also like to remind each club to have a Service Chair or someone recognized to assume duties of a Service Chair. Recognize their importance as a member of your club and be sure they attend your board meetings. Keep service projects relevant to your community by reviewing your service projects and fundraisers every few years. The Club Assessment printed by LCI may help in this regard.

I hope you have found this relevant and helpful as you go forward to a stronger more meaningful club for your community.
