## District Governor Message

### 2025-2026 DG Beth Whitelock



Dear Fellow Rock Stars of 22B!

This is the last district message from me as your District Governor. Though I am looking forward to life being a little easier to manage, I am a tad bit sad to see this time end. It has been the best year of my journey as a Lion. Meeting all

the members and visiting all the clubs has made me even prouder to say that I am a Lion. Your passions to serve others has inspired me this year.

You all have strived to meet every challenge before us this year. So, far we are plus thirty-six in membership. We have just fourteen more

members to bring into our district by June 30th and we will reach our goal of 1250 members. You all can do it! I know you can. Please, please let us avoid that June 30th drop. If you have a member that indicates they will not be returning next year, talk to them and encourage them to stay. Offer support to them be it financially or by listening to their ideas. The Lion might be better suited for another club. It is ok to transfer to another Lions club. We want our members to enjoy doing what they do as volunteers. Finally, feel free club presidents, secretaries, and membership chairs to reach out to me if you feel there is a member that is dissatisfied. The GAT team can assist and offer suggestions.

Clubs embraced our district projects such as eye glass collection and sorting, pull tab collection and the Water by Women filter project. Our district broke record donations to Lions Vision Research Foundation (LVRF), had strong participation and donations over \$17,500 to Leader Dog, supported other causes such as Alex's Lemonade for Pediatric Cancer and the Red Shoe Shuffle for the Ronald McDonald House.

We gained more knowledge this year about LCIF – Lions Clubs International Foundation and how clubs can receive grants towards their service projects. We learned just how important it is to continue to financially support LCIF. Our goal this year for our district is \$40,000. We have met 68% of our goal. We have a way to go to get there. However, I know that we can do it. So, here is the challenge:

**Every club that donates at least \$100 to LCIF this year will earn a chance for a \$250 value gift basket to be drawn at the Banner Transfer meeting on July 12, 2026. Clubs that made more than a \$100 donation will get additional chances to win - \$500 gets two chances and \$1,000 and above get three chances to win. The last date to donate to LCIF for this year is JUNE 5, 2026. To earn credit towards the basket, please make your donation online by the deadline and send me a copy of your donation so you can earn a chance for the basket of goodies. Lions love challenges. We can meet this goal!**

We had a wonderful year of leadership within our district. The following Lions within our district are certified by LCI as Guiding Lions that will be assigned to assist clubs that need support as well as serving as a mentor for new clubs. Several members within our district attended leadership institutes, District Governor Elect School, USA/Canada Forum, and the Multiple District Convention. LCI and our local Multiple District offer excellent training that is inexpensive or free to all members.

This year has been a year of F – U – N. We all learned how to put the fun back into our service projects and our meetings. Remember to have fun in what you are doing before you are not doing it anymore. The district social was F – U – N and special to me. It was a night that Lion Craig and I, along with Lion Joelle, appreciated more than words can say.
