**NEW PROCESSING PROCEDURES FOR DONATED, USED EYEGLASSES (*and HEARING AIDS*)
FOR LIONS DISTRICTS 22-A, 22-B, 22-C, 22-W**

PLEASE NOTE: The numbered instructions below **MAY-OR-MAY-NOT** pertain to your District and what you need to read (*below*), and/or do when collecting donated eyeglasses. Please only follow instructions below your **GREEN District number**.

September 2025

DISTRICT 22-A, 22-B, 22-C LIONS CLUBS (DISTRICT 22-W see pages 4 & 5)

1. AFTER YOU PICK-UP DONATIONS

Each Lions Club should report the quantities of eyeglasses and hearing aids they've collected to their Club Secretary who then sends it to the District Secretary and/or to the Lions Club International Portal. Due to the number of Clubs and quantities of eyeglasses Districts pack together and turn-in for storage, it is impossible to keep track of which glasses came from which Clubs.

NOTE: YOU DO NOT NEED TO CLEAN EYEGLASSES OR DETERMINE PRESCRIPTIONS!

(As formerly was done in some Districts)

Donated glasses only need sorting for their re-usability, then counted and placed neatly into a shipping box that's taped shut, and you're done!

SPECIFIC PACKING & COUNTING INSTRUCTIONS ARE ON PAGE 3

DO NOT PACK OR SEND TO US:



THROW OUT — EYEGLASS LENSES — All separate lenses **NOT** in frames

THROW OUT — GLASSES WITH BROKEN FRAMES

THROW OUT — GLASSES WITH CRACKED or BADLY SCRATCHED LENSES

THROW OUT — GLASSES MISSING LENSES, NOSE PIECES, EARPIECES



2. GLASSES TO KEEP, PACK, AND DELIVER TO US:

ONLY KEEP: Complete pairs of re-usable, recyclable eyeglasses **WITH NO** broken frames, **WITH 2** intact lenses, **WITH 2** earpieces **WITH 2** nose pieces (Usually found on metal frames. On plastic frames they're molded-in)

WE ACCEPT & RECYCLE:

Regular Glasses – Single-vision glasses, bifocals, trifocals

Reading Glasses (*sometimes called Magnifiers*) – with clear or tinted lenses, with or without prescription

Sunglasses - prescription, non-prescription, and clip-on sunglasses

Eyeglasses Cases in good, re-usable condition

(NOTE: Every EYEGLASSES CASE packed into a box **MUST have a pair of glasses inside)**

3. KEEP "DEMO" FRAMES & SEND IN HEARING AIDS

- We **DO** take the DEMO frames that people try on in Optical stores when shopping for new glasses.
- DEMO frames are brand new and unused frames, with either no lenses or clear, unground lenses, and usually have a brand name printed on the lenses.
- Optical stores sometimes donate these new frames to us.
- Please pack DEMO frames in a separate box labeled "DEMO FRAMES" and keep them separated from the glasses we pack to ship. Turn them in separately.
- **HEARING AIDS** – Send in a separate marked box NOT TO BE SHIPPED (*same as w/ DEMO frames*)

4. THE ONLY SHIPPING BOXES WE USE

We use 200 lb. crush weight boxes, size 18"x12"x12" - available as Product # 4181 directly from ULINE @ (800) 295-5510 or through your District.

(NOTE: These boxes are heavier-duty and must be full of glasses and taped tightly shut to withstand travel and stacking on pallets 6 to 8 boxes high without crushing the boxes on the bottom. Cardboard with higher crush weights permits stacking of boxes without the bottom boxes collapsing under weight from above. Each packed box typically weighs 20-25 lbs.)

5. WHAT TAPE TO USE

Use EITHER clear Scotch Heavy Duty Packaging Tape (pictured)

NOTE: BEST PRICE available is the 8-Roll Pack from COSTCO, especially when the tape is on sale.

OR

ULINE Industrial Tape (Model S-423) (800) 295-5510



6. TAPING BOXES & MAKING THEM READY-TO-FILL & SHIP

1. Unfold the flattened box

Locate black printing on the box's bottom



2. Start box assembly by taping the bottom side first


Fold in the smaller flaps into the box, then fold down the long flaps

Run a strip of tape down the length of the center space between the flaps and over the ends of the box




3. Run 2 strips of tape parallel to the center taped seam, between it and the 2 long sides of the box

4. Run one strip of tape cross the middle of the box approximately 9 inches from each end



After filling a box, follow the exact same taping pattern to seal the box's top.



7. HOW TO PACK THE EYEGLASSES AND CASES INTO THE BOXES — THE TWO (2) METHODS AND

8. HOW TO ACCURATELY COUNT THE NUMBER OF EYEGLASSES & CASES PACKED INTO BOXES

- Each Eyeglasses Case MUST have a pair of glasses inside it.
- To best protect glasses in the boxes, please use one of the two box packing methods below:

METHOD 1: PACKING A MIXED BOX WITH A MIXTURE OF GLASSES IN CASES and GLASSES NOT IN CASES

(NOTE: This method packs the most glasses in a box with the best cushioning, but is a little slower to pack.)

- Before you pack a box, **draw a vertical line** on the inside of an end flap
- Write **W/** (for **WITH** cases) on the line's left side and **W/O** (for **WITHOUT** cases) on the line's right side
- Lay 30-40 **EYEGLASSES IN CASES** side-by-side the length of the box's bottom in 2 rows
- Write the number of **EYEGLASSES IN CASES** you put into the box on the left "W" side of line
- Lay 2 rows of **EYEGLASSES NOT IN CASES** (200-350 glasses will often fit) on top of the enclosed cases
- Write the number of **GLASSES NOT IN CASES** on the **W/O** (without cases) side of the column
- Leave space near the top and add approximately 20-40 **GLASSES IN CASES** (for "cushioning") and write the number on the left **W/** side of the vertical line
- Add totals from the left **W/** column to calculate the number of **CASES** packed
- Add totals from the right **W/O** column to get the total of **GLASSES** packed
- Add **TOTALS FROM BOTH COLUMNS** together to get the total number of glasses packed in that box.



- The total from the left side column **GLASSES IN CASES** will be the number of **CASES** you packed. Tape the box shut.
- Write "GLASSES" with a marker on the outside of the box with the number of **EYEGLASSES** in the box, and write "CASES" under it with the number of **CASES** in the box.
- Record **GLASSES** and **CASES** totals on a 2 column tally sheet with one column labeled "GLASSES" and the other column labeled "CASES" and record exact totals from each category that is packed into each of all the boxes.




METHOD 2: PACKING A BOX FILLED WITH (ONLY) ALL EYEGLASSES IN CASES

- As in Method 1, lay (and count) **EYEGLASSES IN CASES** side by side the length of the box's bottom in 2 rows
- Fill to the top with **ONLY EYEGLASSES IN CASES**, counting as you fill it. Then tape it tightly shut.
- Depending on case thicknesses, you will likely fit 90 to 150 **EYEGLASSES IN CASES** into the box
- Write "GLASSES" with a marker on the outside of the box with the number of glasses in the box, and write "CASES" under it with the number of cases in the box. *(Since all the EYEGLASSES going into this box are in CASES, the numbers of EYEGLASSES and CASES you write down will be the same.)*
- Record **SEPARATELY** the total of **EYEGLASSES** and **CASES** on a tally sheet with 2 columns: one column labeled "GLASSES," the other column labeled "CASES" and record exact totals of each category packed into each of all the boxes.

NOTES:

- The **ONLY** 2 items you should list and /or account for on sides of boxes or on tally sheets are **"EYEGLASSES"** and **"CASES"** . . . no other item descriptions, please (*because when everything is shipped to foreign countries, these are the only two items reported to, or considered by, customs officials*).
- **CLIP-ON SUNGLASSES** — put them into boxes with eyeglasses, but **DO NOT COUNT OR LIST THEM** anywhere.
- **TALLY SHEETS** — After completing box packing, please record all box totals on a dated tally sheet listing **"GLASSES"** and **"CASE"** quantities in each box. Turn this into the person who collects the boxes from you to take to the warehouse.
- Remember to record **GLASSES** and **CASES** totals of each box on the outside of each box AND on the Tally Sheet as **"GLASSES"** with the number and **"CASES"** with the number *(as pictured)*.
- **FILL ALL BOXES TO THE TOP** to reduce minimize bottom boxes being crushed by something being piled on top of them
- **FYI** — Packed boxes are ultimately trucked to a D. M. Bowman Trucking Co. warehouse in Hagerstown, MD, put on pallets, and shrink-wrapped for storage. When duty-free documents are approved by the Mexican government, pallets are then trucked to Florida where they are containerized, put on a ship to Mexico, and off-loaded there for distribution to clinics.

Childhood Cancer

CHILDHOOD CANCER

Hello awesome souls.

Hope all of you are doing well, healthy, and safe. During these unique challenging times in the world, our lives continue to evolve. Usually Sunday is my day to leave all our Nation's news, which includes sports at bay and fill my account at the Bank of the Universe with some deeds which fills my spirits and look for the opportunity.

What a joy! I wanted to share with you a great opportunity I availed on Sunday, October 19th participating with Horizon Walks in a walkathon fundraising for Childhood Cancer activities. It is held every year at the Baltimore Inner Harbor Power Point Live. As most of you know, Childhood Cancer one of our 9 Global Causes to make service impact as it presents significant challenges to humanity. Before I explain to you how to participate, here are some of the facts to bring awareness.

Childhood Cancer happens everywhere. Each year, more than 17,000 children are diagnosed with cancer in the United States. Globally, it is estimated that more than 300,000 new cases of cancer are affected each year in 0-19-year-olds; however, this number may be vastly underestimated due to the large number of undiagnosed cases. Childhood cancer is Number 1 cause of death in children in the United States. There are over 500,000 survivors in the U.S, however this does not mean they are cured or free from long-term side effects. The average age at diagnosis with childhood cancer is 10. The most common categories of childhood cancer include leukemia, brain cancer, lymphomas, and solid tumors, such as neuroblastoma and Wilms tumor. In high-income countries more than 80% of children with cancer are cured, but in many low-income and middle-income countries only 20% are cured. These are just some of the facts. Now you can appreciate why our Lions International adapted Childhood Cancer as one of the 9 Global Causes for service impact.

Johns Hopkins Hospital, University of Maryland Medical Center, National Cancer Institute (NIH) and Sinai Hospital are the only 4 hospitals recognized in Maryland that have Pediatric Oncologist to treat childhood cancer patients. The other closest renowned hospital is Children's National Hospital in Washington, D.C. Delaware has several Pediatric Oncologists who treat Childhood Cancer, but no hospital is recognized as Specialized.

Horizon Walks benefits Horizon Day Camp. Horizon Day camp is a not-for-profit organization in Baltimore, which provides activities for hospitalized children and their siblings affected by childhood cancer

throughout the year and summer day camp at no cost to the family. The organization provides year-round programs (Horizon on Wheels), in-hospital recreational activities, and summer day camps. All offered completely free of charge to the family. I have been privileged to partner with the **Horizon Walks** / Horizon Day Camp for the last several years to be of service to children. It was my privilege of making a team "**Central Maryland Lions Clubs**" (**District 22-A**) and designating myself as the Team Captain ☺. It did not hold much traction. Since last year the team is expanded and is named "**Lions of Maryland, Delaware and District of Columbia**". Of course, that is our Multiple District 22. Guess who took the liberty of designating himself as the Team Captain. ☺ Our page link is provided below. The fund-raising walk is over as it is done once a year in October. The donation link is open until December 25, 2025 (for this year) to receive everybody's generosity. Any member, club, sub-District, family members / friends can participate by contributing / donating to our team. It is a worthy cause. No amount is small, and this will bring little joy to every child and sibling affected by childhood cancer to attend Summer Day Camp, participate in in-hospital activities. If your club donates to our team, you can take credit for LIONS PORTAL as participating in one of our Global Causes. A Team is structured for connection, feedback, support, sharing, mentoring, communication and synergy. How well the Team functions is up to us. It's a balancing act.

Service is our main purpose; to Serve we need Members, and when we have Members we need Leadership that means developing members. Let us imagine a Three-legged Stool, three legs are Service, Membership, Leadership. All legs need to be balanced. How well we are functioning at each level, Club, District? What are our challenges? Is the Team working synergistically or in separate stove pipe?

Our Clubs are grassroots of Lions International. The stronger clubs are we are stronger globally. Are we conversing with GAT and transforming our clubs? We need more meaningful and courageous conversations. It is painful but growth and transformation come from that. Sometimes we are swayed by the external factors which do not serve our purpose in the long run. We have novelty now: AI, Chat GPT etc. This helps with boring and tedious tasks but will not solve our human intelligence. AI, the term states it is Artificial. We are more powerful than that. Shuffling the same deck of cards does not help with growth. We need new ways of thinking to solve our problems / challenges. But what if I told you that challenges are a blessing, the greatest form of love. And our desire is an invitation to expand. Would you face our challenges with open arms and desire to transform ourselves into something new?

Let us ask ourselves honestly; how stable is our Three-Legged Stool GAT? Is it not wobbling in every direction? Examine and study the results, does it need to be changed? The results speak for itself. We have Leadership challenge at the club and district level, membership recruiting and retention, service improvement is affected due to membership and leadership. Nothing is impossible to solve and is within our reach. As Einstein once said (paraphrasing), solution to each problem lies in the Answer. All we have to do is ask the right question. Asking right question is risky, that is why we need to have a safe environment to have meaningful courageous conversation. Team development is an evolving process and takes time. Cliques and Klans are very detrimental for this evolution. Do we have any?

We are putting emphasis on Mission 1.5 (which we must). We are in a snail process on this journey, nothing is easy. Some members and some clubs are very effective in recruiting new members. After the recruitment what do we have for

the new members. How well they are oriented (if any at all) at the club level, who is orienting (how experienced and knowledgeable the person is), is someone mentoring the person for his/her development, how well the new person being engaged, we are being inclusive and integrated. When members are dropped (some are unavoidable), are we learning anything from their leaving for our growth? Are the service activities creative and adaptable to changing needs of communities and environment? How collaborative are we with the communities and other clubs? Are all the club officers being trained in person or via Lions Learning Center and continually being updated with the changing organization? How dynamic are we? These are only few questions, a few questions pops up of our Three-Legged Stool. There are many more questions. It is a Team Conversation. All questions have answers, and we must find the right answer. It is like the Beatle's song, "Let It Be". There will be an answer----

We are functioning in Shiloh as before without acknowledgement. The flat portion (top) of the Stool is holding the three legs in balance. It needs continual Action how small or how slow it may be. Everything has its time.

Recently we had one very outstanding Marketing Summit hosted by the Hurlock club. Bob and Steve did an excellent job. There were many superb ideas how to market ourselves. Let us take the next step; we marketed getting new members and we got few. How well prepared are we accommodating the new ones? Have we adjusted anything inside to welcome new members? It is like bringing in a new piece of furniture to our house. We must make many adjustments inside the house to fit in. We may have to get rid of some, move around etc. etc. It is also like selling a house; the Realtor gives many ideas to stage with many possibilities to attract Buyers. It is all Teamwork and coordination. This event was a Shilo action.

I have always loved watching how nature works, especially the way a single seed can become a magnificent tree. Think about it... A oak tree does not need to learn how to grow. The entire blueprint for that towering tree already lives inside the seed. It does not wish, hope, or struggle. It simply unfolds its potential once the right conditions are present. We All work the same way. Inside Us is an

energetic blueprint- a natural code for abundance, creativity, love, and success. It is not something we have to earn or chase. It is part of who We already are.

The problem is, most people try to force growth without realizing their inner soil has become compacted with old beliefs, fear, doubt, societal learnings etc. These patterns keep their innate potential buried. But once we begin to clear soil, it begins to grow naturally. Clearing the soil and fertilizing is our Choice. It is painful for the Growth. It is just like the caterpillar goes through the painful process of cocoon (slimy yucky) then burst into a Beautiful Butterfly. That's what we All are.

Beautiful, Loving, Serving, Remembering and full of Light Souls.

Great things are going to happen with our TEAMWORK and going beyond the Horizon.


